LTC Joseph W. Boscia assumed responsibility as the Deputy District Commander for the United States Army Corps of Engineers Transatlantic Afghanistan District on 20 August 2015. Headquartered at Bagram Airfield, Afghanistan, the District executes construction and engineering operations throughout Afghanistan in support of United States Forces-Afghanistan (USFOR-A) and Operation Freedom's Sentinel.

LTC Boscia was commissioned as an Engineer Officer in 1994 following his graduation from the University of Dayton, Dayton, Ohio, where he earned his Bachelor of Science Degree in Electrical Engineering. He holds a Masters of Science Degree in Engineering Management from the University of Missouri, Rolla. LTC Boscia's military education includes: Engineer Officer Basic Course, Engineer Captain's Career Course, Command and Staff Services School, Command and General Staff College, Airborne School, Air Assault School, Ranger School, Sapper Leader Course and Jumpmaster School.

LTC Boscia previously served as the OIC of the Kabul Area Office for the United States Army Corps of Engineers-Transatlantic Afghanistan District since January 2015.

LTC Boscia's other assignments include tours of duty with the 50th Engineer Company (Assault Float Bridge), 2nd Infantry Division, at Camp LaGuardia, Republic of Korea; 20th Engineer Brigade (Airborne), Fort Bragg, North Carolina; 618th Engineer Company (Light Equipment)(Airborne) and Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 307th Engineer Battalion (Airborne), 82nd Airborne Division; the 20th Engineer Battalion (Mechanized), Fort Hood, Texas, where he served as the commander of Bravo Company; 3rd Battalion (Training Support) (Engineer), 315th Regiment, an Active Component / Reserve Component unit headquartered in New Cumberland, Pennsylvania; 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) and 3rd Special Troops Battalion (STB) where he deployed to Southwest Baghdad for OIF 07-09, and OEF 10-11 during which the 3rd STB partnered with the Afghan Border Police Zone (brigade) command and staff; Royal School of Military Engineering at Brompton Barracks, Kent, England, as the 23rd United States Exchange Office serving as the Senior Tactics Instructor; and the Army Capabilities Integration Center – Forward (ARCIC-F)/TRADOC G-9 in Arlington, Virginia.
