

### Federal Employees Health Benefits Program

The 2016 Federal Benefits Open Season closes Dec. 12. During this Open Season, you can make changes to your Federal Employee Health Benefits (FEHB), Flexible Spending Accounts (FSA), and Federal Employees Dental & Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP) benefits. In October, the Internal Revenue Service raised the cap on health care flexible spending accounts to \$2,600 for the 2017 benefit year.

The Federal Flexible Spending Account Program (FSAFEDS) is increasing the maximum contribution to health care and limited expense health care flexible spending accounts for the 2017 benefit year. The new maximum contribution will increase from \$2,550 to \$2,600.


